# 1. Background

- 1.1 In 2016, the Regional Strategy for the Prevention of and Response to Marine Pollution from Ships (2016-2021) was adopted, providing a framework for regional cooperation and action. While this Strategy achieved progress, it also highlighted areas requiring further improvement. Building on these insights, the Mediterranean Strategy for the Prevention of, Preparedness, and Response to Marine Pollution from Ships (2022-2031), referred as Mediterranean Strategy (2022-2031) was adopted to continue and enhance these efforts over the next decade.
- 1.2 The Mediterranean Strategy (2022-2031) was adopted by the Contracting Parties (CPs) to the Barcelona Convention at their 22<sup>nd</sup> Meeting of Contracting Parties, in 2021 (Decision IG.25/16), reflecting a collective commitment to protect the marine environment through enhanced regional cooperation and adherence to international standards.
- 1.3 Beyond its role as a policy document, the Mediterranean Strategy (2022-2031), represents a call to action. It encourages all stakeholders to unite in pursuit of a shared vision for a cleaner, healthier, and more sustainable Mediterranean Sea. Through collective efforts, the protection and preservation of this exceptional marine ecosystem and its legacy for future generations can be ensured.

# 2. Purpose

2.1 With a view to assist CPs with the harmonised and consistent implementation of the Mediterranean Strategy (2022-2031) and the development of National Action Plans (NAPs), REMPEC developed a draft Guidance Document on the Preparation of National Action Plans for the Implementation of the Mediterranean Strategy for the Prevention of, Preparedness, and Response to Marine Pollution from Ships (2022-2031), hereinafter referred to as the draft Guidance Document.

The draft Guidance Document aims to provide a practical tool to guide individual CPs to the Barcelona Convention in their efforts to implement the Mediterranean Strategy (2022-2031) and, thus, all the regional and international instruments addressing the prevention of and response to marine pollution from ships to which they are Party. The CPs should also encourage all stakeholders to participate in their capacity to implement the Mediterranean Strategy (2022-2031) as well as to develop a self-assessment of national capabilities and performance that should enable them to gage progress made and define any necessary remedial action.

2.2 In this light, the purpose of the Workshop is to equip CPs with the knowledge and tools needed to develop and implement effective NAPs, aligned with the Mediterranean Strategy (2022-2031). Technical guidance and support from REMPEC will be offered to those CPs that so request, to assist in implementing their NAPs.

#### 3. Practical information

3.1 The CPs to the Barcelona Convention were invited to participate at the *Regional Workshop on* the Preparation of National Action Plans for the Implementation of the Mediterranean Strategy for the Prevention of, Preparedness, and Response to Marine Pollution from Ships (2022-2031).

- 3.2 The working languages of the Workshop will be English and French. The event will be conducted in English, with simultaneous translation into French. Certain material/documents will be available in both languages, while other, including the presentations, will be available in English only.
- 3.3 The Workshop aims to provide participants with practical knowledge and tools to implement the Strategy effectively. Through interactive sessions, participants will learn about key international agreements, NAPs and stakeholder engagement necessary to combat marine pollution in the Mediterranean. The Workshop will cover the draft Guidance Document, with a focus on practical applications, monitoring, and evaluation of environmental strategies at national level.
- 3.4 Participants will engage in group discussions, explore case studies, and work collaboratively on completing National Assessments (NAs) and preparing NAPs. They will also review the draft guidance document and contribute to the final recommendations.
- 3.5 Participants are expected to
  - .1 Actively engage in discussions and interactive exercises.
  - .2 Collaborate with other participants in group work to complete the National Assessment and draft National Action Plans.
  - .3 Offer feedback on the draft guidance document.
  - .4 Share their perspectives on stakeholder engagement and national implementation strategies.
- 3.6 Participants will use these guiding questions to deepen their understanding, contribute to meaningful input during sessions, and work collaboratively towards the approval of the draft Guidance Document.
- 3.7 Participants are strongly encouraged to become familiar to <u>Decision IG.25/16</u> prior to the Workshop.

#### 4. Annotated programme

- 4.3.1 Interactive Overview: Ms. Eliana Barleta will provide an interactive overview of the Mediterranean Strategy (2022-2031), focusing on its objectives. Additional participation from CPs will be expected with an interactive Quiz.

- 4.6.1 Identifying Key Stakeholders: Ms. Eliana Barleta will discuss the importance of stakeholder engagement in the development of National Action Plans, identifying key players and their roles in implementing the Mediterranean Strategy (2022-2031).

- 4.7.1 Questions and Clarifications: Participants will have the opportunity to ask questions and clarify any points regarding the introduction to the workshop and its key topics.

- 4.10.1 National Action Plan Development: The Workshop will focus on process for the creation of National Action Plans (NAPs), which follow from the NA, to align national strategies with the Mediterranean Strategy's objectives.

- 4.11.1 Practical Completion of National Assessment: A hands-on session where participants will work on completing a sample National Assessment, applying the knowledge gained during the previous sessions.

- 4.12.1 Practical NAP Development: This session will walk participants through the practical steps for preparing a NAP, including the identification of necessary actions and the process for monitoring and evaluating the NAP's effectiveness.

- 4.13.1 Document Review and Feedback: A review of the Draft Guidance Document, with participants providing feedback on its contents and recommendations for improvement. Participants will be requested to consider and decide on possible approval of the draft Guidance Document.
